Employment & Income (please bring in all income earned from entire household, including dependents)

- W-2 forms for the year
- Unemployment Compensation (1099-G)
- Miscellaneous Income including rent (1099-MISC)
- Retirement Income (1099-R)
- Social Security (1099-SSA)
- State & Local Income Tax Refunds (1099-G)
- Child Support Received
- State Assistance Received (FIA) (DHS)
- VA Benefits

Homeowner & Renter

- Mortgage Interest (1098)
- Property Tax Statements**
(Winter '15, Winter '16 and Summer '16) Bring all 3
- Rent Paid During Tax Year (Landlords name and address)
- Heating Cost of Home for the Year
- Sale of Your Home or Other Real Estate (1099-S)
- Second Mortgage/Line of Credit Interest Paid

Financial Assets

- Interest Income Statement (1099-INT)
- Dividend Income Statements (1099-DIV)
- Proceeds from Broker Transactions (1099-B)

Expenses

- Gifts to Charity (must have receipts)
- Unreimbursed Expenses Related to Your Job
(travel, uniforms, union dues, tools)
- Child Care Expenses (Bring Day Care's ID number and address)
- Unreimbursed Expenses Related to Volunteer Work
- Student Loan Interest Paid (1098-E)
- Plate/Vehicle Registration

Self-Employed

- Business Income (Form 1099-MISC) and/or own records
- Business-Related Expenses: Own records Showing Totals of Each Category of Deduction
- Farm-Related Expenses: Own records Showing Totals of Each Category of Deduction
- Rental-Related Expenses: Own records Showing Totals of Each Category of Deduction
- Business Mileage
- Automobile Interest paid if for business
- Schedule K-1's

Health Care

- 1095-A: if you had MarketPlace insurance
 - 1095-B: if you had private insurance
 - 1095-C: if you had employer covered insurance
